SHORT HILLS PROVINCIAL PARK

At over 735 hectares Short Hills is the largest single park area in the Niagara Peninsula. It is a core area of the Niagara Escarpment Biosphere Reserve and nodal park in the eastern Niagara Carolinian Forest zone of Ontario. An extensive trail system offers kilometers of hiking on terrain as varied as cliff edges and waterfalls to stream beds, meadows, and wetlands. Seven Short Hills trails connect to Camp Wetaskiwin.
